## **Minutes of the Quarterly Meeting of the Association**

### **Patrol**

There was no report from the security patrol officers or Jane Jaskevich, Neighborhood Watch Coordinator. Discussion took place concerning door-to-door solicitors. We were reminded that solicitors must have an ID issued by DeKalb County, and that no solicitation is allowed after dark.

### **Zoning**

No Zoning Report.

Resident John Turner of Vista Valley Road, expressed concerns about his next-door neighbor at 1258 Vista Valley Road, who apparently has too many renters in her house. In addition, she is once again adding on to her house in order to house more tenants. John told of his frustration in dealing with the county departments. He asked for help from the association. Several other Vista Valley residents spoke to the issue.

### **Website**

Henry Batten reported on activity at the web site. Usage continues to go up.

### **Traffic**

Barry Summers reported that construction of sidewalks on Sheridan Road should start by year's end. Land acquisition for the Sheridan/Briarcliff intersection improvement is to begin in November. He reported that 2 additional speed limit signs had been posted on Sheridan Road.

On behalf of the Cheshire Bridge Road Task Force, Susan Starr reported that the task force is continuing to work with the City of Atlanta and the Georgia DOT to improve traffic congestion at the Cheshire Bridge Road/Lindberg/LaVista intersection. Plans for improvements to Cheshire Bridge Road include bikes lanes, but they will not actually be constructed until additional funds are available. It appears that the City of Atlanta is "dragging its feet" with the whole process.

Susan also reported that Club 112 appears to have improved their situation since Atlanta police and a private security firm began patrolling the premises.

Susan reported that the Easter Seals Child Development Center is not having a negative impact on traffic in the area.
